


KoshSmart BINGO Contest

Wildlife Wonders - Snails

How slow can you go? As slow as a snail ... whose speed is about 50 yards per hour; this is about 0.5 inches per second. While they don't move fast, they do move at a very steady pace. Snails are one of the slowest creatures on the Earth. And since they rely on moisture to survive they will hibernate during a dry summer. They can actually sleep for up to 3 years.
