2023 LKRA Town Hall Meeting Summary, held on Saturday, August 12, 2023

23 people were in attendance

- 1. Welcome Jennifer Cummings welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced the Executive and other volunteers who were present.
- 2. Purpose/Objectives of the LKRA were reviewed.
- 3. Projects or services that could be undertaken by the LKRA in 2024 and beyond including suggestions for Dam Fund monies. Ideas were not limited to the dam funds, all ideas were welcome. All ideas will be submitted to a committee and reviewed.
 - stock the lake with more walleye and bass;
 - more fire pumps, with good locators;
 - increasing membership either through zone captains or hiring young summer student ambassadors to collect and educate; or have students through volunteer service hours; if eligible apply for federal funds to employ students;
 - invest in "square" to take payments by Visa at regatta and for zone captains;
 - look into automatic collection of fees program, worth the cost;
 - funding from lake association for gas pumps; cost to new owners would be \$65,000 for above-ground tanks; or perhaps association could help with fund raising events like a golf tournament; would help reduce fuel spills; lot of support from cottagers and a fundraiser could be a big hit; Go-Fund-Me; movie night on the beach; would it be proper to give to a profit organization;
 - investigate fuel tank weekends;
 - don't have to spend the money just because it is there;
 - gravel for private roads, although not all cottagers are on private roads;
 - Township docks are in bad repair; concern about taking over municipal responsibilities; liability might be a difficulty; possibly buy gravel and just leave a pile for people to use.
 - communicate defibrillator location; possibly purchase another for another location on the lake;
 - purchase benthic mats to smother fan wort, can be moved around and then later sold; possibly association can purchase and loan to cottagers;
 - more education around controlling the wakes of boats; post video of damage; maybe signage
 on buoy; hold education days; may not be everyone who knows what "mind your wake"
 means; some boats create more wake slow than fast; show the FOCA video again;
 - use the box and a bulletin board at the marina more effectively for membership and education;
 - should check if winners of prizes at Regettas are members;
 - Regatta is a big draw for members and important to our membership; event is for family and friends though; guests can participate but perhaps restrict major prizes to members;
 - revisit the giving out of the stickers only to those who pay membership;
 - "I Paid my membership" to hang on the 911 signs;
 - we are reaching people that are on Facebook and social media but not other people; maybe put up signs about meetings on roads; e-newsletters are only opened by 50%;

- campers are a huge problem; very large signs have been erected and they have been very effective;
- updating database to track dues, members, addresses and contact info is a challenge;
- need to have a survey for people not in attendance;
- hold AGM at a time to ensure input into HBM budget;
- HBM did approve a fund for private road associations of \$1500 every other year, first-come first-served; pool is \$15,000 for Township;
- leave the funds for a more than valid cause and must go to a vote at the AGM; membership
 fees and donations should go into the operating budget which should not ever be in deficit;
 dam monies will not go into operating budget and will be held and not used to augment ongoing activities;
- hold some of the funds of the future emergencies; determine how much to spend each year;
 sustainability of organization important; keep a rainy day reserve.
- 4. Volunteers for the Review Committee Rob Milne and Harry Major volunteered to sit on the committee. An Executive Committee member will be assigned. Will ask for more volunteers when we survey.

LKRA Objectives:

- 1. To promote the **cultural and social interests and activities** of the seasonal and permanent residents on Lake Kasshabog, in the Township of Havelock-Belmont-Methuen;
- 2. To raise awareness, and to promote **environmental sustainability** for the benefit of all residents on Lake Kasshabog and vicinity;
- 3. To study and report on all government plans affecting the residents or the uses of land on Lake Kasshabog and vicinity, and to make **representations to the various levels of government** with respect to such matters; and
- 4. To liaise with and advocate for our members at like/associated organizations.

Process from here:

- Town Hall Brainstorming summary prepared and circulated to LKRA Executive
- LKRA Executive members will decide on the composition and mandate of an Advisory Committee for the Reallocation of the Dam Funds
 - The Chair of the Advisory Committee should be a member of the LKRA Executive
- Advisory Committee will look at brainstorming summary, prepare an analysis and options, and makes a recommendation including rationale for those recommendations
- Digital Survey sent to LKRA members only outlining recommendation and rationale; members are given opportunity to add new ideas or make comments.
- Advisory Committee reviews digital survey feedback and decides on next steps, which is communicated to the LKRA Executive. This may or may not lead to a recommendation that is voted on at the next AGM.
- LKRA Executive communicates with the LKRA membership on the status of the work being done by the Advisory Committee for the Reallocation of the Dam Funds.
